Position Summary

The Psychology Intern provides evidence-based psychological support to individuals and groups to promote cognitive, emotional, behavioral, and social well-being. This role involves assisting with client assessments, implementing therapeutic interventions under supervision, collecting and analyzing behavioral data, and collaborating with interdisciplinary teams to support holistic client care.

Key Responsibilities

- Conduct intake interviews, behavioral observations, and assessments under supervision to identify client needs and goals.
- Assist in developing and implementing individualized treatment or behavioral support plans.
- Support the delivery of evidence-based therapeutic interventions (e.g., CBT-informed techniques, mindfulness, and coping skill development).
- Track client progress and contribute to documentation, including session notes and data summaries.
- Collaborate with interdisciplinary team members (e.g., case managers, music therapists, behavior specialists, caregivers, and other healthcare providers).
- Participate in supervision sessions, case reviews, team meetings, and interdisciplinary collaboration.
- Contribute to program evaluation and outcome measurement by gathering and analyzing qualitative and quantitative data.
- Help design and deliver educational materials and psychoeducation sessions for clients, families, and staff.

• Maintain confidentiality and adhere to ethical and professional standards as outlined by the American Psychological Association (APA).

- Currently enrolled in or recently graduated from an accredited Psychology or Clinical Mental Health program (Bachelor's or Master's level).
- Foundational knowledge of psychological theories, assessment tools, and evidence-based interventions.
- Interest or experience in working with individuals with neurologic conditions, developmental disabilities, or behavioral health needs preferred.
- Strong interpersonal, observation, and analytical skills.
- Excellent written and verbal communication abilities.
- Demonstrates compassion, professionalism, and cultural competence.
- Open to feedback, reflective practice, and ongoing professional growth.

Work Environment

- Supportive, interdisciplinary, and learning-focused environment.
- In-clinic sessions conducted Monday–Friday, with occasional opportunities for community-based learning experiences.
- Position may require active participation in group sessions, movement-based interventions, or behavioral support activities.
- Occasional evenings or weekends may be required for events or professional development opportunities.
